RULES

Please read these rules carefully

The show will be conducted where possible in accordance with the rules and standards of the Royal Horticultural Society, the National Chrysanthemum Society, the National Dahlia Society and the Royal National Rose Society.

1. Staging may take place at the show venue between the following times:

Evening before Show: 4.30pm. – 8.00pm.

Show morning: 8.00am. – 10.15am.

2. Class Cards will be issued by the Show Secretary and must be placed reverse side up (i.e. the side with the Exhibitor's No., Section No. and Class No.). This is to be placed in front of the exhibit and each exhibit MUST have a card. This is the responsibility of the exhibitor.

3. Number of Exhibits is limited to one per exhibitor in any Class. No two persons from the same family, cultivating the same garden or allotment may enter the same Class.

4. The decision of the judges concerning the merits of the exhibits shall be regarded as final. Judges are empowered to withhold any prize, trophy or certificate if the subject is deemed to be unworthy.

5. The decision of the committee is final in all matters connected with the Show. The Committee reserve the right and powers to decide in cases of dispute.

All complaints MUST be handed in to the Show Secretary in the Hall by 3.00pm on the day of the Show. Complaints MUST be in writing and accompanied by a £1 deposit, which will be refunded if the complaint is upheld.

6. For the award of Trophies a 1st prize counts 4 points, a 2nd prize counts 3 points, a 3rd prize counts 2 points and a Highly Commended 1 point.

Highly Commended will only be awarded if there are 6 or more entries in a Class.

7. All Exhibits must be the exhibitor's own grown produce, from their own garden or allotment. An exception to this is the Floral Art Classes.

8. Exhibits in Pots must have been in the Exhibitor's possession for at least **three** months before the date of the Show.

9. Exhibitors may use their own 'Bikini' vases, however, there are vases available from the Society. A limited number of extra large vases for the exhibition of Giant Dahlias only, are available on request.

10. All Exhibits are to remain the property of the Exhibitor and may not be removed before 4.00pm. Any exhibits remaining after 4.30pm will be considered a donation to the Society and will be disposed of appropriately.

11. Variety cards – all exhibits should bear a variety card, if possible. These will be available from the Show Secretary and your requirements should be listed on your entry form. They will be prepared and available with your entry cards. No personally hand-written cards will be accepted.

12. In this Schedule, The words 'kinds' and 'cultivars' are used in this context:

13. Liabilities and Losses: The Society will not be liable for any loss or damage howsoever caused.

14. Prize Money should be collected within 7 days, otherwise it will be assumed to be a donation to the Society.

15. Novices: These Classes are intended to encourage newcomers. Anyone may enter a Novice Class who has not previously won a first prize for the particular exhibit called for in the Schedule. Novices may enter any other Classes in the Schedule.

16. Challenge Trophies: Any member wishing to compete for any of the Challenge Trophies must be a fully paid-up member of the society by the last day of the month preceding the Show.

17. Entry Fees:

Members: 20p per class – Max £5.00*.

Non Members 30p per Class

*Max £5 entry fee applies for 25 or more entries.

19. Fruits classified as vegetables. The following, though botanically classified as fruits, are, for the purposes of Horticultural Shows, classified as vegetables:

Aubergines, Beans, Capsicums, Chilli Peppers, Courgettes, Cucumbers, Marrows, Mushrooms, Okra, Pumpkins and Squashes, Peas, Rhubarb, Sweetcorn and Tomatoes.

20. Exhibits ‘Not according to Schedule’: any exhibit which does not conform with the wording in the Schedule shall be disqualified and the judge shall write on the entry card ‘NAS’ and add a note as to the reason.

21. The RHS Points System for marking vegetables, is governed by the difficulty of their production. The following may be helpful to exhibitors.

1. Each member of the family who wishes to enter must use a separate entry form.
2. Completed entry forms, with fees, are to be returned to the show secretary at least two days prior to the Show.

N.B. Entries will be accepted up to 12 noon on the day preceding the Show. The cost for late entries is 40p per class.
3. Date of birth is only required for those entering a Young Peoples Class in Section 10. If you have entered any of these classes please make sure that you enter your date of birth overleaf.
4. For all flower, fruit, vegetable and plant exhibits, please specify (if known) varieties in the specified column. This information will be use to generate the variety cards to be displayed alongside exhibits. If a class requires more than one of the same variety card, follow the variety with the number of variety cards required (for example: SNOW PEAK - 3 reqd). Variety cards provided by entrants will be removed.
5. For entries in Section 9 – Handicrafts, please state the table space required to display the item in the specified column. If to be displayed flat please provide the depth (D) and width (W) of the table space required. If to be displayed upright please also specify the height (H) of the exhibit. Failure to provide this information may mean that your entry will not be allocated sufficient table space to display it to its full advantage.
