Trading Store

31st October is the end of the Society's financial and trading year and, surprisingly, despite the difficult last 8 months, the overall trading level has, in fact, not only been maintained, but has, by a fraction, exceeded last year.

A big blow this year has been the closure of Warwicks of Wickham at the end of September. They have supplied us with most of our stock and provided excellent service for well over 50 years, and are therefore not easy to replace. We are having to look for various sources in order to cover the wide range of items that Warwicks supplied. We have set up new accounts with BHGS at Funtington and King's Seeds, in addition to existing ones with LBS in Lancashire and Taylor's Bulbs, but we will still need to look elsewhere for smaller quantities of some items and may face longer delivery times.

The Store itself remains in good shape and we haven't had to do as much maintenance this year. Work is on-going on the border at the side of the Store where the protective rails and posts have rotted.

We are sad to hear that Waterlooville Allotments and Gardening Society is permanently closing their Store before Christmas. However, they have generously said that we can have any fixtures and fittings that may be of use and any residual stock. We very much hope that some of their members will come and join us.

In these restricted and unusual times particular thanks are due to the helpers at the Store who have enabled us to open within the guidelines and we are very grateful that so many members have continued to support the Society and helped to keep us on a sound footing even though sadly, we have had to cancel our Shows and monthly speakers.

Please note that the Store will not be open on 26th December and 2nd January 2021.

Let us hope that next year will be a better year for everyone.
